In Central Kentucky, the Bluegrass Disc Golf Association (BDGA), an affiliate club of the

PDGA, promotes the sport of disc golf. The BDGA, a not-for-profit organization chartered in 2006, is comprised of over 100 disc golf enthusiasts from Lexington and surrounding cities. In the past year, the organization has provided the following

services to the disc golf community:

- Weekly leagues
- PDGA sanctioned tournaments
- Benefit tournaments
- Clinics
- Disc golf course maintenance
- Disc golf course development & design

While our membership is the core of our organization, participation in club-sponsored events is open to anyone who is interested. League play, tournaments, and clinics are open to the general public. The BDGA also recognizes the importance of giving back to the central Kentucky community through sponsoring several charity events.

The BDGA has donated to proceeds from benefit events to organizations such as God's Pantry, Special Olympics of Kentucky, and the KY Juvenile Diabetes Foundation.

Disc Golf is one of the world's fastest growing sports. According to the Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA), The number of disc golf courses has risen from over 1500 in the United States in 2003 to over 7000 world-wide in 2016. In addition, the number of disc golf tournaments sanctioned by the PDGA increased during the same time period from 39,000 to over 170,000.

While the growth of courses and sanctioned events speaks to the popularity of competitive disc golf, it does not represent the hundreds of thousands of casual players who enjoy the sport around the world.

Disc golf is a highly accessible recreational activity which requires a disc (which usually costs around \$10) and a set of targets. The rules of play are very similar to traditional ball golf as players try to get their discs to the targets in the fewest number of throws.

Because it is a low impact activity, the sport can be played by virtually everyone.

In central Kentucky, courses are located in the following communities: Lexington, Berea, Georgetown, Frankfort, Lawrenceburg, Mount Sterling, Nicholasville, Richmond, Winchester, and two new courses in Versailles. Most courses are free and open to the public.
